In order for the Knights of Pythias to increase membership, we must increase awareness of our existence within our community. On Memorial Day, Monday May 29th 2006, the Little Neck-Douglaston Memorial Day Parade (the largest Memorial Day parade in the United States) will be held on Northern Boulevard from Jayson Avenue, in Great Neck, to 245 Street in Douglaston. The parade route is only a little over a mile. We have been given a spot and the opportunity to participate and be part of the parade. We will have our banner and expect a contingency of at least 10 members marching. We will march in the Second Division and will assemble at 55 Northern Boulevard at 1:30pm. The parade is scheduled to start at 2:00pm. Media coverage from several television news organizations, as well as some newspapers, is expected. It will give us a wonderful opportunity for recognition.

If you don't plan to march but would like to be a spectator, I recommend that you

find a good spot around 246 Street, in front of 711 as during the duration of the parade, from 2:00pm until after 4:00pm, hot dogs and beverage will be served free of charge across the street at the St. Anastasia school yard.

Our very own brothers David Gratt and Monty Leschen will once again act as Parade Judges, as they did in 2005. In 2003 Brothers David and Monty were honored as Division Marshals by the parade organization. In May of 2001 I was honored by the parade organization with the Douglas S. MacKay Community Service Award and in 2005 with the Chairman's Award.

If you are at the parade look for me! I just happen to be one of the directors of the Parade Organization. I will be driving a golf cart and wearing a suit and my Australian safari hat (my trademark).


